The program will feature harpist, Meghan Elizabeth Caulkett and mezzo soprano Teresa Procter. Meghan is the founder of 47 Strings, an innovative organization with a mission of bringing the harp out of the concert hall. Within the last three years, over 70 solo harp and chamber music concerts have been presented throughout the greater Houston area in schools, hospitals, for senior groups and in concert series. Meghan is in her fourth season as the Principal Harpist of both the Baton Rouge Symphony Orchestra and the Symphony of Southeast Texas. She has performed with the Houston Symphony, the San Antonio Symphony, Dallas Opera, Musiqa and the Greenbriar Consortium.

Mezzo soprano, Teresa Procter delights in operatic, chamber and concert performance and is a strong advocate for ensuring the accessibility of classical music. Teresa is an HGOco Artist with the Houston Grand Opera, a member and frequent soloist in the Bach Society of Houston and works with the national organization, Music for Autism.

Both Meghan and Teresa hold master's degrees in music performance from Rice University's Shepherd School of Music. They have also been named Young Artists with Da Camera of Houston and Teaching Artists with Young Audiences of Houston.

The 47 Strings Harp and Voice Duo Recital will feature selections from "Three Sephardic Songs" by Castelnuevo-Tedesco and "As a Guitar" by Poulenc. Additional pieces by composers such as Britten, Malotte and Ravel will also be performed.
