Mr. Larson has performed with the Baltimore, Boston, and Philadelphia Orchestra's and was principal bass of the Haddonfield Symphony. He has been an active chamber musician and an avid teacher.





Robin Kesselman

Robin Kesselman was appointed Principal Bass of the Houston Symphony Orchestra by Maestro Andrés Orozco-Estrada. He has performed as Guest Principal Bass with the Saint

Paul Chamber Orchestra, travelled internationally with both the Philadelphia Orchestra and the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and performed with the National, Atlanta, and Baltimore Symphonies. Outside of the orchestra Kesselman frequently performs as a soloist and chamber musician. He teaches private lessons locally and masterclasses around the country and abroad.

Donald Howey

Donald Howey has been a member of the Houston Symphony since 1999. He has performed with the Grand Teton Music Festival and the Sun Valley Summer Symphony and has been principal and soloist with the



Houston Chamber Orchestra. He began playing the bass at age fifteen in his hometown of Sudbury, Massachusetts.

Donald completed his Masters degree in Music Performance at Rice University in 1998 and graduated with distinction from Boston University in 1995.



Burke Shaw

Burke Shaw, double bass, studied at the Juilliard School in New York City and the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia. After graduating, he was appointed principal bass of the Orquesta Sinfonica de

Galicia, Spain. In 1999 he moved back to the United States to play in the Oregon Symphony in Portland, OR and a year later he won a position in the bass section of the Houston Symphony.

He plays on a double bass made in Rome in 1744.
