January Program



InFLUX flute and harp duo, January 9, 10:30 a.m. at St. Thomas the Apostle Episcopal Church. Mark your calendars!

inFLUX Flute and Harp, based in Houston, TX, was founded in 2015 by flutist Izumi Miyahara and harpist Emily Klein. The ensemble creates innovative concerts in the community by partnering with non-profit organizations. Highlights from past projects include "Dionysia 2017 - Houston Book of the Dead: How to Live", a collaboration between inFLUX, New Hope Housing (an assisted living facility for low income and formerly homeless individuals), and Center for Creative Work at the University of Houston. *Dionysia* is an annual festival created by the University of Houston to immerse the Houston community in arts events; for this project,

inFLUX created a program of music consisting of works by Charles Rochester Young, Vincent Persichetti, and Erik Satie/Takemitsu that reflected the theme of "Hearth and Home: Houstonians Sharing Their Life Journeys."

As part of inFLUX's mission to perform classical music outside the concert hall, the duo cultivates relationships with communities of care. Partnerships include Music for Autism, Sheltering Arms Senior Services, Daniel Pearl World Music Days, and the Houston Methodist Hospital's Crain Garden Recital Series. The duo also performs in traditional concert settings with recitals on the Memorial Classical Music Series (Houston), Phil Kramer Recital Series at New Hope Lutheran Church (Missouri City, TX), and a residency at Avaloch Farm Music Institute in Boscawen, New Hampshire during the summer of 2018.

In addition to their performance schedule, Emily and Izumi are passionate educators and work with Da Camera of Houston's Young Artist Program and American Festival of the Arts to bring performances and masterclasses to students in the Houston and Pasadena Independent School Districts.


